Enjoy a Clock Tower tour and rise to the top of Brisbane City Hall, one of Brisbane's most iconic buildings and the symbolic heart of our city. Tours operate daily taking visitors up the Clock Tower in a beautiful, old, hand-operated lift, providing a bird's-eye view of the city. The Clock Tower has been in operation since the opening of City Hall in 1930 and is 87.47 metres high with an observation platform at 64 metres, which people can walk out onto to absorb the unique view of Brisbane. Tickets are free and allocated on a first come, first served basis. You can obtain a ticket in person on the day at the Museum of Brisbane reception counter on level 3.

years and under must be accompanied by a supervising adult. Tickets only need to be purchased for participating children.
